Happy Holiday Greetings,

Friends of Charlie's Place (FOCP) had a good year supporting Charlie's Place, the Clear Creek/Gilpin County Animal Shelter. With your help, we saved over **200 dogs and cats** from euthanasia at kill shelters, including hurricane-ravaged Houston. Friends of Charlie's Place makes this possible by covering **all** of the transfer costs and medical care necessary for the transferred dogs and cats, including spays/neuters, heartworm tests, vaccinations, and dental care — at no cost to county citizens.

All proceeds from FOCP fundraisers go directly to support the needs of Charlie's Place and local animals. In 2017, year-to-date, FOCP spent more than \$5,600 on the spaying and neutering of shelter animals and \$27,400 on their medical needs. Additionally, \$6,500 was spent on training to help make the animals more adoptable. FOCP also contributed over \$7,800 of assistance to citizens using our spay/neuter voucher program. No animal coming into Charlie's Place has ever had to go without needed medical care, thanks to FOCP.

FOCP and Charlie's Place work with other community partners, like the Clear Creek Metropolitan Recreation District (CCMRD), to sponsor fun, family events, like the Canine on the Creek 5k and Hike With A Shelter Dog. We also donate pet food to Loaves and Fishes for families in need. And we continue to work together for the good of all of our counties' residents. The Gilpin Arts Festival, Saratoga Casino, Friends of Empire Fall Festival, Chrome Salon, Gilpin County Fair and many more local organizations and businesses work with FOCP to keep Charlie's Place the wonderful state-of-the-art facility that it is.
